Community Water Fluoridation Programs

*One year of providing fluoridated water in the United States is estimated to save \$6.5 billion in averted direct and indirect dental treatment costs.

*Communities served by fluoridated water save an average of \$32 per person a year by avoiding treatment for cavities.

*The return on investment for community water fluoridation varies with size of the community, increasing as the community size increases, and is cost-saving even for small communities. Communities of 1,000 or more people see an average estimated return on investment of \$20 for every \$1 spent on water fluoridation.
